Pennsylvania Sees Spike in Homeless Population

According to a recently released U.S. Census Bureau report, the number of individuals in Pennsylvania's emergency and transitional shelters rose by 51.7% between 2000 and 2010.


- Nationally, the number of individuals in emergency and transitional shelters increased by 22.6% to just over 209,300 people.
- Nearly 8,300 Pennsylvanians – 4% of those listed in the report — are in the nation's emergency/transitional shelter population.
- 22.6% of the individuals are children under the age of 18 (a 7.9% increase).

DHS and Auberle Open Drop-in Center for Youth

The Allegheny County Department of Human Services is collaborating with Auberle social service agency to operate "412 Youth Zone," a full-time drop-in center for youth ages 16 to 24. The 13,000-square-foot center, located in Wood Street Commons in Downtown Pittsburgh, will offer a fitness room, showers, short-term child care and a registered nurse on site. Visitors can work toward a GED and learn other skills.

Dr. Jim Withers Named a CNN "Top 10 Hero"

In recognition of his work with homeless people in Pittsburgh and abroad, CNN has named **Dr. Jim Withers** one of its "Top 10 CNN Heroes" for 2015.


In 1992, Dr. Withers founded Operation Safety Net to administer to the homeless. In addition to providing medical care, he and his team deliver food, blankets and hygiene items to people living on the streets. He estimates that his team been able to move 1,200 people into apartments and other housing during the past 15 years.

Each honoree will receive \$10,000 and be honored at "CNN Heroes: An All-Star Tribute," a globally broadcast event airing on December 6.

It highlights the unique challenges of parenting while incarcerated," said **Katie Jones-Pomeroy**, a Curriculum and Instructional Specialist with the PA Child Welfare Resource Center based outside of Harrisburg.

HCEF to Hold Sixth Annual Summit

Hundreds are expected to participate in the Homeless Children's Education Fund Summit on Friday, November 13, at the Wyndham Grand Hotel in Downtown Pittsburgh.

The daylong event will feature a presentation by

Jama Shelton of True Colors Fund, an organization that works to end homelessness for LGBTQ youth. **Emmai Alaquiva**, founder of Hop Hop on L.O.C.K., will talk about the power young people have to change their lives.

The day's activities will include more than 20 interactive



workshops highlighting local and national initiatives; legislative and policy updates; a youth art exhibit; and local resource fair.

The day will conclude with the presentation of the Youth Resiliency and Unsung Hero Awards.

The event will take place from 8 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. and is free. Registration is required.
